Everything in between is your build, in order. Take it one section at a time.



READ ME FIRST

This is a field manual, not a novel — you are not meant to read it front to back. Jump to the station you need:

RIGHT NOW Mission Brief + Procurement Roster.

BEFORE BUYING The Complete Parts List — order everything in one batch; shipping is the bottleneck.

WHILE BUILDING Work the build chapters in order; each one is a station, not a lecture.

BEFORE THE EVENT Game Day — the only chapter that matters at hour two.

RUNNING LATE? Open the companion WEEK-BY-WEEK calendar and jump to your current week.

■ ONE SITTING RULE

Read Mission Brief + Procurement Roster today. Everything else waits until its week.



PICK YOUR BAR

*Same suit, three different finish lines. Pick yours now — builders polish for the wrong one and burn weeks. The same build can be finished to three different bars — pick yours **now**, because builders who polish for the wrong one burn weeks.*

LEAN · €80-200

Casual

Reads as Vader at 5m, glance distance. Spray-paint smoothness OK. Skip codpiece, chain, fine-detail panel paint.

EFFORT · ~80 hrs

MID · €300-500

Convention

Reads as Vader at 1m, casual scrutiny. Three filler-primer + wet-sand cycles. Most builders land here.

EFFORT · ~150 hrs

501ST · €1500+

Approved

Reads as Vader under inspection. Screen-accurate proportions. Every weathering pass justified. The lifetime piece.

EFFORT · 300+ hrs



THE FALLBACK PLAN

*A first-time build of this suit is **80–150 hrs** of hands-on work across **16 weeks**. Life happens — so decide right now what gets cut when the clock wins. Finished beats perfect.*

BEHIND EARLY Drop first: Codpiece. Nobody will notice at 5m.

BEHIND LATE Simplify next: Belt + Boxes + Buckle, Chain, Shin Guards (×2) — buy instead of make, or borrow.

EMERGENCY Every printed part has a buy option. Switching one part to bought can save a whole week.

ALWAYS The final week is for wearing it, not building it — dress rehearsal beats one more coat of paint.

🕒 THE HONEST RULE

If a piece is not started two weeks before the event, it is not in this year's costume. Build it for the next one.



THE COUNTDOWN

The whole plan on one page — tick the boxes as the weeks fall. The full week-by-week calendar is a separate companion PDF.

Weeks 16–13 ☐ Procure + start helmet print

Weeks 12–9 ☐ Print armor + schematics

Weeks 8–5 ☐ Sand + filler + paint

Weeks 4–3 ☐ Strap + LED wiring

Week 2 ☐ Dress rehearsal · suit up

Week 1 ☐ Buffer · fixes · game day



MISSION BRIEF

A full Vader cosplay breaks into **twelve core elements**. None are optional if you want the silhouette to read from across a room.

Skip a shoulder piece and the whole top half collapses. Skip the chest panel and you stop reading as Vader at distance — you read as "person in black."

What You'll Print

- ▶ Helmet · Chest plate · Shoulder armor (×2)
- ▶ Chest panel · Belt panels · Codpiece
- ▶ Shin guards · Chain · Saber hilt (optional)

What You'll Buy

- ▶ Undersuit · Tunic / robe · Cape
- ▶ Wide leather belt · Tall boots · Leather gloves
- ▶ LED kit · Spray paint
- ▶ (or pre-made helmet + saber if not printing)

△ TIMING REALITY

A first-time Vader build is **80–150 hands-on hours**. Print time runs in background. Sanding + painting is the bottleneck — not the printing.

Start prints tonight. Place orders tomorrow. Shipping is the bottleneck on every Vader build that ever missed a deadline.



PROCUREMENT ROSTER

Every piece has a budget option and a premium option. You can build a passable Vader for **€80–120** if you already own a printer. A 501st-grade one runs **€1500+**.

Most Builders Land

€300–500

— the convention bar, three filler-primer cycles, recognizable at 1m

Taobao / AliExpress · Cheapest Path

Search Chinese marketplaces in Chinese, not English. Taobao gives 30–50% better prices than AliExpress for identical items. Key search terms:

UNDERSUIT ★	达斯维达 内搭 紧身衣 cosplay — get the REAL Vader undersuit (ribbed), not generic black, if in budget
SABER	光剑 黑武士 / 维达 (lightsaber Vader)
HELMET	达斯维达 头盔 (Darth Vader helmet)
CAPE	黑色斗篷 长款 (black cape long)
BOOTS	骑士靴 黑色 (knight boots black)

△ SHIPPING WINDOW

Taobao via agent (Superbuy / Pandabuy): **2–4 weeks**. AliExpress: **3–6 weeks**. Amazon: **3 days but 2x the cost**.

CHINA SOURCING

The cheapest path runs through **Taobao**. Paste the Chinese search terms below (or use AliExpress with the English term — same products, higher price). Prices in RMB. Helmet and saber procurement are covered in their own chapters.

UNDERSUIT	达斯维达 内搭 紧身衣 cosplay — the real ribbed/quilted Vader undersuit, ¥120–250. Prefer it over a generic 黑色 紧身衣 长袖 (¥80–150) — it reads far more Vader.
TUNIC / ROBE	黑武士 长袍 — or 黑色 长款 长袍 cosplay
CAPE	黑武士 斗篷 — long black, ¥100–250
BELT	黑色 宽腰带 真皮 7cm — 7 cm minimum width
BOOTS	黑色 高筒靴 男 骑士靴 — knight / motorcycle style
GLOVES	黑色 皮手套 长款 男 — long covers the wrist gap
LED KIT	3mm LED 灯 套件 纽扣电池 — chest + belt buttons, ¥30
COMBO	黑武士 cosplay 套装 全套 — tunic+cape+undersuit in one, ¥300–800

WESTERN SOURCES — BACKUP

Matte black + chrome silver spray from any hardware store, small acrylics (red, white, amber/gold), a 120→1000 grit sandpaper pack, 25mm nylon webbing + side-release buckles + Velcro. Custom undersuit and ESB tunic+cape listings exist on Etsy/eBay if Taobao shipping is the bottleneck.



WORKSHOP STOCK

*Everything consumable, in one shopping trip — **hardware store**, filament order, and the tools worth borrowing instead of buying.*



Hardware store

Matte black spray (×2) · chrome silver (×1) · grey filler primer · small acrylics (red, white, amber/gold) · sandpaper 120/240/320/400/600/1000 · Bondo or Tamiya putty · painter's tape · carnauba car wax (final helmet polish) · super glue · 5-min + 30-min epoxy · flex adhesive (E6000 / Pattex) · hot glue sticks · black silicone caulk · 25mm black nylon webbing (≥3m) · side-release buckles (×4) · adhesive Velcro · black snap buttons (×4, cape) · 1m small-gauge steel chain · black thread + needle.



Filament order

Black PLA — 3 kg matte minimum. The full build eats ~2–2.5 kg; buy spare for failed prints. Plus a small spool of clear PLA for the LED button caps (optional: transparent red).



Tools — borrow, don't buy

3D printer (or a pay-per-print service) · hobby knife · files + sanding sticks · drill with small bits · soldering iron for the LEDs · scissors, ruler, marker. If you own none of these, a school makerspace or a maker friend covers the lot.



HELMET ACQUISITION

*The single most identity-defining piece. **Three paths.** Pick one before Week 14 or you'll burn the entire procurement window.*

Path A · 3D Print (Cheapest, Most Work)

Filament + post-work = **~€20 cost, ~40 hours labor**. Two-piece print, sanded smooth, primed, painted, clear-coated. Lecter's wearable file (Printables 31565) is the standard.

- ▶ Dome + faceplate, alignment holes for assembly
- ▶ Three filler-primer + wet-sand cycles minimum
- ▶ Acrylic lens cutouts for the eye visors

Path B · Buy a Costume Helmet

Taobao ¥75 (~€10) buys a wearable display helmet. Plastic, light, smoothable. Sand + paint = **2 hours, looks 80% as good as Path A for 5% of the work.**

Path C · Premium Replicas

Anovos, Denuo Novo, Black Series voice-changer at the budget end. **€300–1500**. Wear it, don't build it. The lifetime piece.

▲ FIELD WISDOM

If under €75 total budget: Path B every time. Path B saves 30+ hours and 90% of frustration.



SABER ACQUISITION

*A metal-hilt saber from Taobao with a neopixel blade beats a printed PLA hilt by a wide margin. **Weight, click, sound — none of it works in plastic.***

Path A · 3D Print Hilt Only

GhetiCLE Threaded Core (Printables 144068). Uses a 3/4" steel rod for weight + strength. Free file. Best for builders who want to swing real.

Path B · Cheap LED Saber (€15-25)

AliExpress / Taobao "lightsaber with sound." Two AA batteries, soft glow. Won't survive a stage fight but looks fine in photos.

Path C · Mid-Range Neopixel (€80-150)

The best value tier. A neopixel saber (Cyber Saber and similar) from Taobao. Metal hilt, neopixel blade (color-changeable), motion-reactive sound, USB-C charging, detachable blade.

Path D · Galaxy's Edge / Premium

Galaxy's Edge custom builds, Ultrasabers, Saberforge. **€200–800.** Combat-grade. Skip unless you're stage-fighting.

△ THE PHOTO TEST

Saber dying mid-photo is the photo nobody wants. Always carry a spare battery, or pick a USB-C model and top it up between events.



MANUFACTURING FILES

3D print files vanish. Designers go private, get DMCA'd, delete accounts. **Save locally on download.** The file may not be there in a month.

Path 1 · Paid One-Stop (€20)

Galactic Armory ROTS — single download, everything except helmet, pre-cut for small printers, pre-hollowed for LEDs.

Path 2 · Free Near-Complete Bundle

Jace1969 (Printables 22865) — the closest thing to a free one-download set. Includes 3 helmet variants, chest plate, shoulders, chain, shin guards, and a lightsaber. **Does NOT include the chest control panel** — source that separately.

▲ THE JACE1969 GAP

The chest control panel (the lit-up box with all the buttons) is the most identity-defining detail piece up close. Jace1969's bundle does NOT include it. Add **TheMaker77 (Thingiverse 3889513)** or **BrettProjectGuy (Printables 832807)** on top of Jace to complete the build.

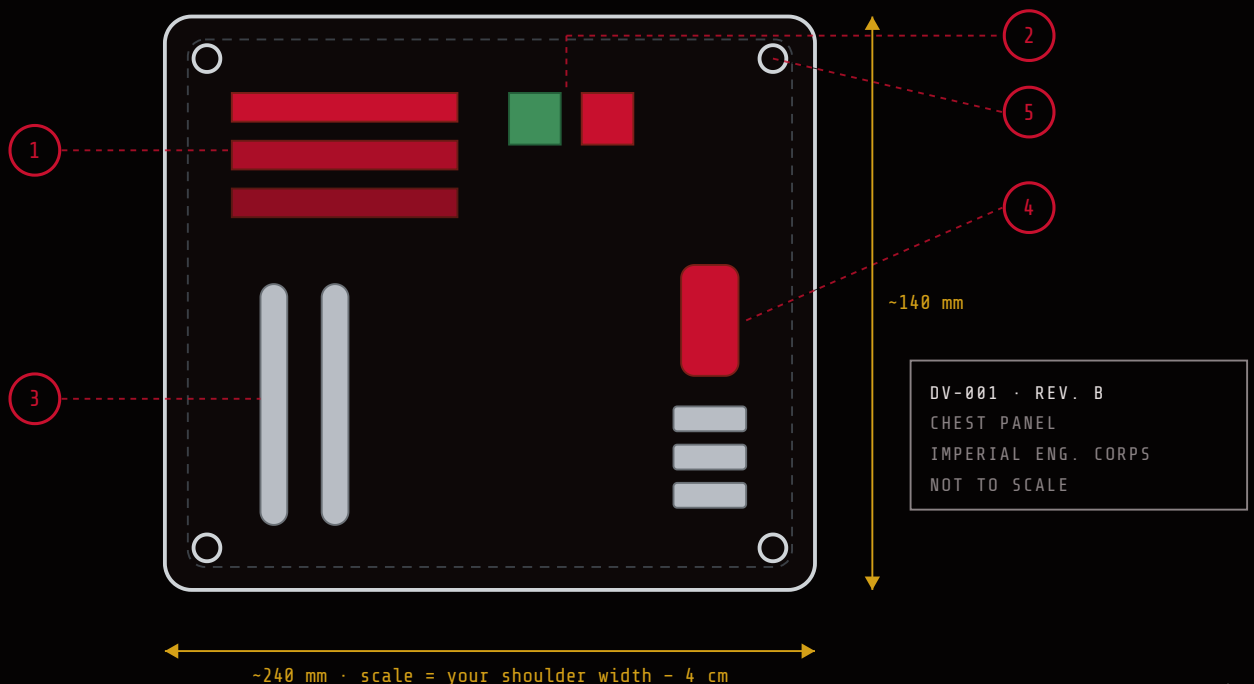
△ WHEN A FILE DISAPPEARS

Four sites, not two: MakerWorld, Printables, Thingiverse, Cults3D. **STLFinder.com** is the meta-search. Trace popular files to the original designer — remixes vanish faster than sources.



SCHEMATIC DV-001 · CHEST PANEL

Drawing **DV-001 · Rev. B** — the chest control panel. Not to scale; size it to **your shoulder width minus 4 cm**.

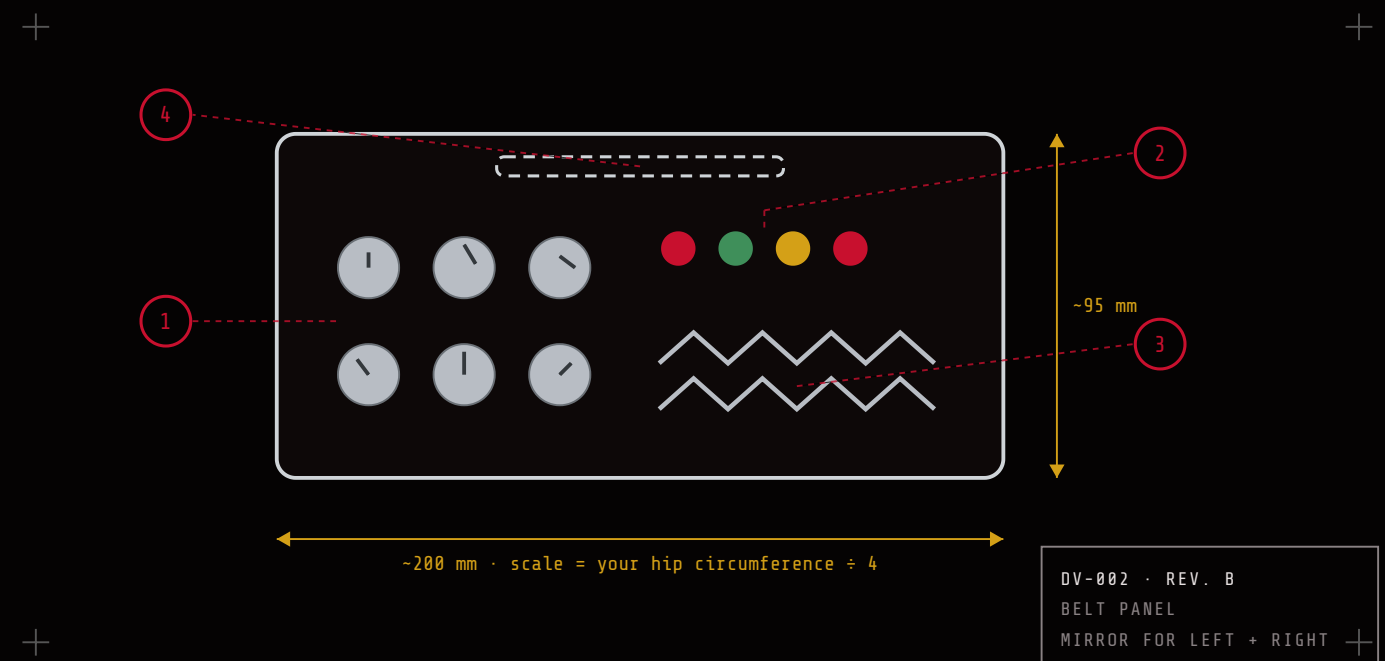


[1] 3× horizontal indicator bars · red · backlight with 3mm LEDs from the rear · [2] 2× square buttons · green + red · paint, or clear PLA with LEDs behind · [3] 2× vertical chrome rod accents · metallic silver, drybrush dark · [4] 1× tall red button + 3× silver rectangular switches · mixed materials · [5] 4× strap-mount holes · drill 4mm · thread nylon webbing, backpack-style



SCHEMATIC DV-002 · BELT PANEL

Drawing **DV-002 · Rev. B** — the belt panel. Print two and **mirror one for left/right**. Size = your hip circumference ÷ 4.



[1] 6× rotary knobs · silver caps on dark grey base · [2] 4× LED button caps · clear PLA · alternating red / green / amber · [3] diamond-pattern tubing · metallic silver with dark inset · [4] belt slot · 50mm × 5mm · threads onto the wide leather belt



PAINT PROTOCOL

Paint is where Vader builds live or die. Three filler-primer cycles minimum. Anything less and the print layers show through.

Which Black to Use

Not all black is the same black:

- ▶ **Tamiya XF-69 NATO Black** — deep matte, slightly cool. The screen-accurate choice.
- ▶ **Citadel Abaddon Black** — pure black, slight sheen. Cheaper but reads too "comic book."
- ▶ **RAL 9005 (Jet Black)** — industrial coating, perfect for big surfaces.

Three-Cycle Process

- ▶ **Cycle 1:** filler primer → wet-sand 400 grit → spot-fix bad layers with putty
- ▶ **Cycle 2:** filler primer → wet-sand 600 grit → check at 1m distance
- ▶ **Cycle 3:** filler primer → wet-sand 800 grit → no more print lines visible
- ▶ Then color coat, then satin clear coat

△ TEMPERATURE WARNING

Spray paint below 15°C goes on grainy. Above 30°C goes on too thin. **18–25°C is the window.** Indoor space-heated room in winter, garage at dawn in summer.

SEMI-GLOSS · DOME VS MASK

Vader's "black" is not pure black — it reads slightly blue-black with semi-gloss reflectance; pure matte eats the costume on camera. The helmet is semi-gloss with the dome glossier than the mask: polish the dome with carnauba car wax for the final wet-look shine. Only have matte and gloss varnish? A 50/50 mix gives you satin.



BUILD SEQUENCE

Two assembly paths. **Pick one and commit** — mixing leads to a Frankenstein build that fails partway through the event.

● DEFAULT · STRAP SYSTEM (recommended)

~6 hours assembly. Webbing + buckles + Velcro. Suit goes on and off cleanly, adjusts as the wearer grows, reusable for years. **This is the recommended path for most builders.** Phases 1–7 below.

● QUICK · STICK-IT (kid builders / short events)

~1 hour assembly. Glue lighter pieces directly to undersuit / belt. Faster, simpler, perfect for **kid builders** putting together their first Vader, single-event Halloween costumes, or anyone wearing the suit under 4 hours. **For casual wear and fun — not serious events** (cons, 501st, contests). **Chest plate still needs straps** — too heavy to glue alone.

Quick Path · Stick-It Map

Glue choice: E6000 / UHU 6700 / Pattex Power Easy — flexible bond, clear-drying, holds PLA to fabric for years. Hot glue works for one event. **Never superglue** — goes brittle, tears fabric.

CHEST PANEL	Glue to tunic chest, center. Wide bead of E6000 on back edge, weight overnight.
SHIN GUARDS	Glue to top of boots, OR Velcro to trouser calf.
BELT BOXES + BUCKLE	Glue to the belt itself — comes off as one unit.
CODPIECE	Zip-tie or glue to front of belt.
CHAIN	Sew into cape hem with black thread, OR glue to codpiece top.
SHOULDERS	Straps better — curved surfaces fight glue.
CHEST PLATE	Straps required — too heavy, sags in an hour.

▲ FIT BEFORE GLUE

Put the tunic on the wearer. Mark each position with chalk or tape. Glue is **permanent** — no second chances on placement.

● OPTIONAL · GLUE FIRST, ADD STRAPS FOR LOOKS

Start with the glue version (Stick-It). Then later, if you want, add straps to make it look more like the real Vader. **But the regular strap build is HIGHLY recommended** — it's the best way to do it. Glue-then-straps is just an extra option for a first Vader.

| Default Path · Phase 1 · Chest Panel Strap System

- ▶ 2 strips of 25mm nylon webbing, ~60cm each, one per shoulder
- ▶ Mount with 2-part epoxy or screw through the 4 strap holes
- ▶ **Hot glue WILL fail at the wrong moment.** Don't use it here.
- ▶ Side-release buckles + Velcro tail — goes on like a backpack

| Phase 2 · Belt Assembly

Thread wide leather belt through the belt panel slots. Buckle dead center. Belt panels flank it. Sit on hips, not waist.

| Phase 3 · LED Wiring (Optional)

- ▶ 3mm LEDs hot-glued behind clear button caps
- ▶ 3V CR2032: no resistor needed for red/yellow/green. Limit: 2–3 LEDs max.
- ▶ 9V battery: **470Ω resistor in series with each LED.** Without it, LED pops in seconds.
- ▶ Toggle switch on rear of chest cavity
- ▶ **Test on breadboard before gluing.** Once it's lit and you know it works, then commit.

| Phase 4 · Comfort Engineering

PLA armor against skin chafes after 90 minutes. **Solve it now, not at the event.**

- ▶ Closed-cell EVA foam, 3–5mm, glued to armor interior
- ▶ Pad the chest plate clavicle edge — the #1 chafe point

- ▶ Pad codpiece corners + shin guard top edge
- ▶ Moisture-wicking athletic compression undersuit. Cotton chafes more than no shirt.

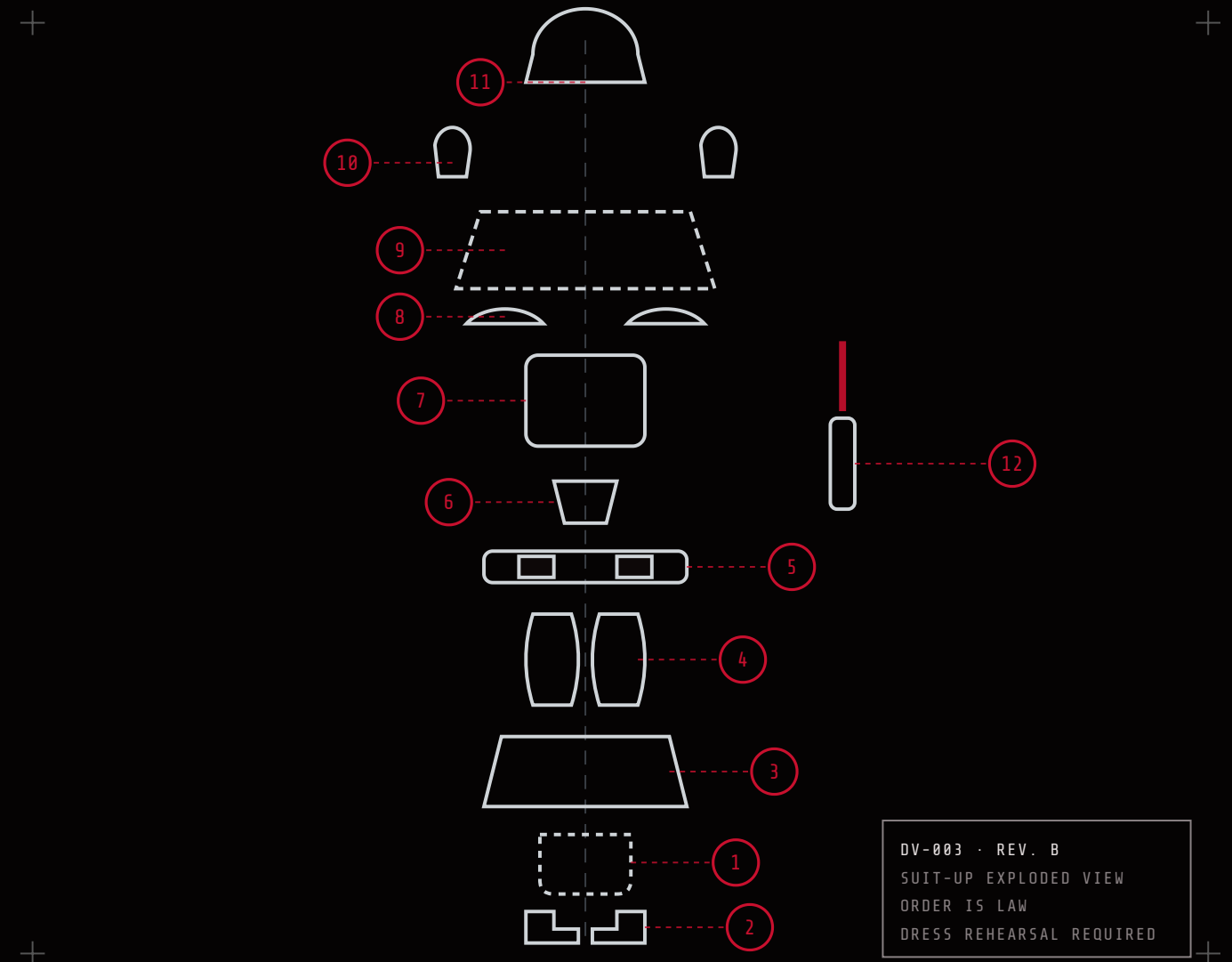
| Phases 5-7

Shoulder armor → cape weighting (chain in hem) → suit-up rehearsal. **Two days before the event, full suit-up in front of a mirror.** Sit, stand, stairs, doorways, drink water. Find what doesn't fit, fix it, do it again.



SUIT-UP · EXPLODED VIEW

Drawing **DV-003 · Rev. B** — the suit-up sequence, exploded. **Order is law:** dress bottom-up, helmet last. Run a full dress rehearsal before game day.



[1] undersuit · compression base layer · [2] tall black boots · [3] tunic / robe over undersuit · [4] shin guards · Velcro behind · [5] wide leather belt · with panels · [6] codpiece · hangs from front belt · [7] chest panel · strap on like a backpack · [8] shoulder armor · over tunic · [9] cape · clip to tunic shoulders · [10] black leather gloves · [11] helmet · LAST · adjust chin strap before walking · [12] lightsaber · clipped to belt



GAME DAY

▲ THE ONE RULE · NON-NEGOTIABLE

The helmet has no airflow and gets HOT. Fit a fan, hydrate, and take breaks — overheating is the real enemy. Never skip this.

*"This is where most builds die — not at the printer, at the event. **Plan the day, not just the suit.**"*

Pre-Flight Checklist · 30 Min Before

- ▶ ☐ Saber fully charged. Run for 30 sec — confirm light + sound. Pack spare battery.
- ▶ ☐ Chest panel LEDs lit. Spare CR2032 in pocket.
- ▶ ☐ Cape pressed flat, no folds. Hem chain seated. Snap buttons intact.
- ▶ ☐ Helmet padding seated and dry. Foam crown ring centred.
- ▶ ☐ All Velcro engaged. Chest plate, shoulders, shins, codpiece.
- ▶ ☐ Field repair kit in belt pouch. Water bottle filled.
- ▶ ☐ Phone charged. Soundboard or breathing loop pre-loaded.
- ▶ ☐ Cooling neck wrap soaked + chilled. Ice cubes in bandana ready.
- ▶ ☐ **ID inside helmet:** taped card with name + emergency contact. Lifesaver if you faint.

Ventilation + Heat Management

Helmets don't ventilate. Builders tap out after 2 hours when they didn't plan for heat.

- ▶ Thin moisture-wicking base layer under undersuit
- ▶ Gel cooling neck wrap (PVA polymer, 2–3 hrs cold)
- ▶ Water bottle + long flexible straw in belt pouch — sip every 20 min

- ▶ **Heat exhaustion signs:** heavy sweating, dizziness, nausea. **Helmet OFF immediately.** Heatstroke is a hospital visit.

△ THE 90-MINUTE RULE

First time in full suit at a real event? **Plan a hard stop at 90 min** for a full assessment. Helmet off, lights on, mirror check. Most issues you can fix in 5 min if caught early.

● ● MORE GAME DAY LINES

- ▶ “I find your lack of faith disturbing.” — *slow, one pause before 'disturbing'*
- ▶ “You have failed me for the last time.” — *stay calm — the calm is what makes it scary*
- ▶ “The Force is strong with this one.” — *slight helmet tilt, like you're actually impressed*

😬 FOR LAUGHS — KID EDITION

- ▶ I find your lack of snacks disturbing.
- ▶ Luke... I am your line leader.
- ▶ Join me, and together we can rule the playground.



THE VOICE

The suit makes you **look** like Vader. The voice makes people **believe** it. Three pillars: **LOW. SLOW. CALM.**

1 · Go low — from the chest

Yawn once. Feel where your voice sits after the yawn — that relaxed, deep place is **chest voice**. Hum down to your lowest *comfortable* note and speak from there. Do not growl and do not rasp your throat: Vader is not angry gravel, he is a deep, calm engine.

2 · Go slow — pauses are power

Vader never hurries. Say the sentence... then **stop**... then say the next part. Every statement ends flat and final, like a door closing. If you think you are speaking too slowly, you are almost slow enough.

3 · The breath

The famous mechanical breath is two sounds: a slow pull "**kohh**" (in) and a soft release "**purr**" (out), made through a half-closed throat — or through a cupped fist over your mouth. The rule: **breathe between lines, never while talking**. Line... breath... line. That rhythm IS the character.

● ● PRACTICE LINES

- ▶ "I find your lack of faith disturbing." — slow, flat, one pause before *disturbing*.
- ▶ "The Force is strong with this one." — calm, almost curious.
- ▶ "You have failed me for the last time." — quieter is scarier. Never shout.

Resonance & gear

Speaking inside the helmet adds natural echo — for practice without it, cup both hands (or a paper cup) over your mouth. A cheap toy **voice-changer** (~€10–20) clipped in the chest adds the metallic edge; convention Vaders run a small **mic + mini-amp kit** hidden in the chest box. Watch a real tutorial: youtube.com/watch?v=taT_ySQWvIk ("How To Voice Darth Vader", JD Cornwell). Or go full lazy-Sith: a phone in the chest playing a **12-hour breathing loop** — the suit breathes all day, you save your

lungs for the lines. ⚠ **Throat care:** the depth comes from the **chest**, never a squeezed throat — if it hurts, stop, sip water, go a little higher.



BUILDER TIPS

"The build is done. **These are the small things that make you a good Vader, not just one in armor.**"

Tip 01 · Photo Composition

Black armor eats light. Shoot from slightly below, indirect lighting, dark background. Hold the saber low and angled — don't point it at camera.

Tip 02 · Kids Love Vader

Be patient with small kids who run up to you. Crouch down to their level when posing for photos. A grumpy Vader ruins their day; a thoughtful one makes the event.

Tip 03 · Budget Snapshot

LEAN (€80-150)	Printed everything · Taobao undersuit/cape · spray paint · LED toy saber
MID (€300-500)	Licensed electronic helmet · printed armor · mid-tier saber · decent cape
501ST (€1500+)	Anovos/Denuo helmet · custom undersuit · neopixel saber · vacuum-formed armor

Tip 04 · License + Attribution

Most printable Vader files are **non-commercial**. You can build, you can wear, you can post photos. **You cannot sell prints, sell builds, or charge for appearances** based on these files. The 501st operates on an appearance-fee-free volunteer model — keep it that way.

Tip 05 · 501st Costume Reference Library

The CRL is the gold-standard reference for screen-accurate proportions. **crls.501st.com** — search "Darth Vader." Every era documented. If you're going for 501st approval, this is your bible.



VARIANT REFERENCE

Vader changes across films. **Pick one era and commit.** The differences are subtle but real, and chasing all of them at once leads to a Frankenstein build that reads as "off" to fans without anyone knowing why.

ANH (1977)	Rounder cheeks · larger eye lenses · slight chin protrusion · "TIE pilot" influence · less angular shoulders
ESB (1980)	Canonical look · refined cheek angle · deeper "death's head" appearance · deeper chrome trim · cleaner panel lines
ROTJ (1983)	Cheeks pinched slightly inward · eye lenses slightly larger · most "skull-like" · cape slightly shorter
ROTS (2005)	Brand-new helmet · no weathering · slightly rounded · brighter LEDs · pristine paint
ROGUE ONE (2016)	Refined ESB style · subtle CGI updates · slightly taller dome · brighter indicator bars
KENOBI (2022)	Cracked-mask era · weathered ESB · burn scars implied · most "in-between" look

△ FROM THE FIELD

Pick your era before Week 16. Builders who chase variants mid-build never finish the first one.

BEGINNER RECOMMENDATION · BUILD ESB

ESB is the most documented, most referenced era, with the most files available. Once you've built ESB you can shift to other eras with helmet + chest panel swaps. Don't start with ANH or Rogue One unless you have a strong reason.



GLOSSARY

"If you've read every section and still don't know what a soundfont is, that's on us — not you."

Terms used throughout this manual, in plain English.

501ST LEGION	Worldwide Star Wars costuming org. Free to join if your costume passes inspection. The reference standard for screen-accurate builds.
BRIM	Thin disk of plastic auto-added around a print's base for bed adhesion. Snaps off after. Use on tall or thin-base parts.
CR2032	Flat coin-cell battery, size of a 2-Euro coin. Powers small LEDs and the chest panel. Cheap — pack spares.
PLA	Most common 3D printing plastic. Cheap, easy, glues + paints well. Softens above 50°C — don't leave armor in a hot car.
PETG	Tougher than PLA. Handles heat better (good for outdoor summer events), more flexible, trickier to print clean.
GYROID INFILL	3D-printed lattice pattern strong in all directions. Best for armor that takes load.
INFILL	The lattice inside a print. 15–25% is plenty for cosplay armor. 100% wastes filament + time.
NEOPIXEL	Programmable RGB LED strip. In saber hilts: smooth ignition, color-shift, clash flashes. The "good" saber tech.
FILLER PRIMER	Thick spray primer that fills print layer lines. Three coats of fill + sand = smooth like injection moulding.
SLICER	Software that converts a 3D model into printer instructions. PrusaSlicer, OrcaSlicer, Cura, Bambu Studio. Free.
SOUNDFONT	Audio package for a neopixel saber: ignition, hum, swing, clash, retraction. "Vader ROTS", "Vader ESB". €5–15 ZIP files.
STL / 3MF	3D model file formats. STL is universal; 3MF carries more data (colors, settings). Both load into any slicer.

80–150 hours of build for maybe 6 hours of wear. The math looks wrong until you see it.

The first kid who freezes mid-step. The parent who turns their phone sideways without thinking about it. The other Vader at the con who nods at you, builder to builder, because they know exactly what their own 80 hours felt like.

The four-year-old who hugs your shin guard. The teenager who whispers a word under their breath that their mother didn't teach them.

The build isn't the cape and the chest panel. **The build is the room reorganizing itself around the silhouette when you walk in.** The parts list can't list that. That's the part you only get by finishing.

SHARE YOUR BUILD

Post photos to r/cosplay, the Sith Lord Detachment forum, or just tag your local maker space. Other builders learn from your successes and failures. Pass this manual on. The cosplay community runs on shared knowledge.

SABER CRAFT

The blade is half the costume — fight like the character. **Shien/Djem So**, wielded single.

FORM V · SHIEN/DJEM SO — “The Way of the Krayt Dragon”

Pure dominance — block the strike, then crush the striker. Heavy one-handed and overhead blows delivered from a near-stationary stance; the armor takes the hit, the counter ends the fight. Djem So suits a man in heavy armor who never needs to run: stand, absorb, answer twice as hard.

Heavy-strike control: raise the saber overhead, hold a two-second pause of total stillness, then drop it in one straight line to a dead stop at chest height — ten reps each side, power from the stillness, not the swing.

△ DUEL SAFELY

Duel-grade polycarbonate blades only, never thin display tubes. Agree intensity before you start, no strikes to head or hands, and staff or dual spins need a full 3m of clear space.

COMPLETE PARTS LIST

Every piece referenced in this manual, grouped by where you get it. Shop in batches — fewer trips, fewer forgotten items.

PRINT THESE PARTS

Your 3D-printing queue. Test-print one piece before committing the whole suit.

- **Helmet** — Dome + faceplate. ¥75 Taobao base available — sand + paint.
- **Chest plate** — Roman Z Véšek (MakerWorld 189792) — primary. Free near-complete bundle: Jace1969 (Printables 22865). Paid: Galactic Armory €20.
- **Chest control panel** — TheMaker77 Thingiverse 3889513 (bundle) or BrettProjectGuy Printables 832807. NOTE: NOT in the Jace1969 bundle — must be sourced separately.
- **Shoulder armor (x2)** — Roman Z Véšek MakerWorld 189792 (bundled with chest) or Jace1969 Printables 22865 (free bundle). Mirror one STL for the pair.
- **Belt panels / boxes (x2)** — In TheMaker77 bundle. Print one, mirror for second.
- **Belt buckle** — In TheMaker77 bundle.
- **Codpiece** — MakerWorld 1834924 (free) or in Galactic Armory set.
- **Shin guards (x2)** — chadbaycroft Thingiverse 3244260 (life-size) OR Jace1969 bundle (Printables 22865 — includes shins). Avoid the OLD standalone shin file.
- **Saber hilt** — A neopixel saber (metal hilt, sound) from Taobao works — no print needed.

BUY THESE

Order all at once — shipping is the bottleneck.

- **Undersuit / robe / tunic** — Black long-sleeve base layer.
- **Cape** — Long black flowing cape. Check thrift stores first.
- **Wide leather belt** — What the belt panels mount onto.
- **Tall boots** — Black, calf-height. Knee-high if possible.
- **Leather gloves** — Black, gauntlet-style.
- **Steel chain (1m)** — Hardware store €5–8/m, paint black, sew into cape hem. ALT: print Jace1969 bundle chain.
- **LED kit** — 3mm LEDs · resistors · CR2032 or 9V battery · switch. Red + green + white.
- **Spray paint** — Black matte (Tamiya XF-69) · clear coat · small detail colors.

Everything breaks at hour two. A sandwich bag with these seven things turns a costume emergency into a two-minute pit stop.

SUPER GLUE GELReattaches snapped prints and popped seams in 60 seconds. Gel doesn't run.

BLACK GAFFER TAPEInvisible on dark builds — holds a cracked plate through a whole event.

SAFETY PINS + VELCROInstant strap repair, hem fix, cape re-hang.

ZIP TIES (BLACK)Broken buckle, loose greeble, sagging belt box — tie it and move on.

PAINT PEN (BLACK + SILVER)Covers scratches and scuffed edges between photos.

SPARE BATTERIESFor LEDs and soundboards. The saber always dies at the door.

MICROFIBRE CLOTHHelmet fingerprints, lens fog, dusty boots.

■ PACK IT THE NIGHT BEFORE

One bag, one pocket (or a helper's backpack). If you have to go looking for glue, it is already too late.
